

Daniel 9:1-3 Jeremiah's 70 Years

- c. 652-648 – birth of Jeremiah
- 627 – Jeremiah's call to ministry, 13th year of Josiah (1:2)
- c. 620 – birth of Daniel
- 621 – book of the law found in temple 18th year of Josiah (2 Ch 34:8,14)
- 609 – Josiah slain at Megiddo by Pharaoh Neco (2 K 23:29)
 - Jehoahaz reigned 3 mos.
 - Jehoiakim installed by Neco as king (2 K 23:34)
- 605 – **Jeremiah's first prophecy of 70 years** (Jer 25:1-11)
 - First deportation from Judah**, including Daniel (Dan 1:1)
 - Egyptians defeated by Babylonians at Carchemish
- 604 – Nebuchadnezzar's statue dream (Dan 2)
 - Daniel promoted to governor of Babylon (Dan 2:48)
- 597 – **Second deportation from Judah** (10,000), including Jehoiachin (2 K 24:14)
 - Zedekiah appointed king
 - Jeremiah's second prophecy of 70 years, letter to exiles** (Jer 29:10)
- 593 – Jeremiah sent another letter/prophecy to Babylon in the fourth year of Zedekiah, by the hand of Seraiah son of Neriah, quartermaster for Zedekiah and the brother of Baruch (Jer 51:59-64)
- 588 – Siege of Jerusalem begun
- 587 – Jeremiah imprisoned (Jer 32:1-2)
- 586 – Jerusalem destroyed
 - Third deportation from Judah** (Jer 52:30)
 - Gedaliah appointed governor, assassinated (Jer 40:5, 41:2)
 - Jeremiah taken to Egypt by Jewish refugees (Jer 43:5-7)
- c. 580 – Jeremiah died in Egypt
- 539 – Babylon fell to the Medes and Persians under Cyrus (Dan 5:30-31)
- 538 – **Daniel read the prophecy of 70 years from Jeremiah** (Dan 9:1-2)
 - Cyrus' return decree (Ezra 1:1-4)
- 536 – Daniel's last recorded vision, 3rd year of Cyrus (Dan 10-12)
