"About 3,000 were added to their number that day" – conservative estimates put the population of Jerusalem at this time around

2:42-47 - Early Communal Instincts



"they were together, and had all things in common . . . selling their possessions, sharing with whoever had need"


Does this teach communal living?

Why were the early believers hanging out in the temple?

Final Thoughts

The Holy Spirit is at work, using the words of Peter and the actions of the other believers to draw people to himself.

The conversion of the hearts of the people who believed is evident from their actions.



To give an estimate of the size of the temple and surrounding area, the Court of the Women covered an area of about 53,000 ft². This could have easily held six thousand worshipers.
