Paul and his companions were prevented by God from evangelizing in Asia or Bythinia. Instead, they were called to Macedonia. The route from Pisidian Antioch to Troas shown here was about 430 miles. At about 15 miles per day, this would have taken a month (29 days). The two-day voyage to Neapolis was about 135 miles. Philippi was about 8 miles inland from Neapolis.
