



Gallio as an Anchor for Pauline Chronology



Gallio was proconsul of Achaia beginning in May, AD 51. These posts were normally assigned for a single year, rarely for two, so he was probably replaced not later than May, AD 52. Paul's 18 months in the city of Corinth likely began in late AD 50 and ended in spring or early summer AD 52.



Fresco of the judgement of Solomon, depicted as a Roman judge on a *bema*; from Pompeii, 1st century AD. This illustrates the sort of raised platform commonly associated with the judgment seat. This kind of judgment platform is known from places like Corinth and Philippi.
