
27-30 Jews attempt to kill Paul

31-40 Paul is arrested, but allowed to speak




Food for Thought

"Thus was the first enclosure. In the midst of which, and not far from it, was the second, to be gone up to by a few steps: this was surrounded by a stone wall for a partition, with an inscription, which forbade any foreigner to go in under pain of death" – Josephus, *Antiquities* 15:417.
