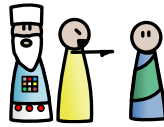

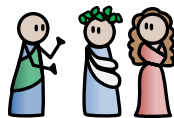

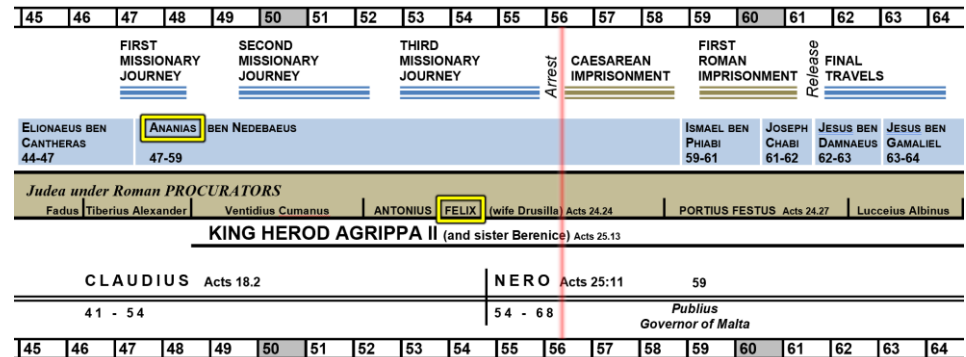

▼ Paul's arrest in Jerusalem and his removal to a prison in Caesarea Maritima happened in the **spring of AD 56**. As the chronological chart below shows, this was while **Ananias** ben Nedebaeus was the high priest, Antonius **Felix** was governor of Judea, Herod **Agrippa II** was king of the northern regions (the Golan Heights—Iturea, Trachonitis, Batanaea, Gaulanitis), and **Nero** was the Roman emperor.



▼ “But some days later Felix arrived with Drusilla, his wife who was a Jewess, and sent for Paul and heard him *speak* about faith in Christ Jesus. But as he was discussing righteousness, self-control and the judgment to come, Felix became frightened and said, ‘Go away for the present, and when I find time I will summon you.’” (Acts 24:24-25)
